Dear Brothers, dear Sisters

Full of new experiences and thoughts after our last trip to Ukraine, it is with joy and gratitude to our Lord that we write this next letter to you.

We started our stay in Ukraine in Vinnytsia, where we visited our loved ones whom we help every day.

One of these people was 85-year-old Mikhail, a Holocaust survivor. Mikhail and I have had cordial bonds of friendship for many years. This is very valuable to him because after his wife's death he is completely alone. His sons live deep in the former USSR, and given the current situation, contact with them is very difficult. He recalled



with gratitude his stay in Poland as part of the "Remove The Stones" project. Our constant prayer is that Mikhail will open his heart to the Savior Yeshua. He heard the Gospel about salvation many times, so we also ask you to pray for his salvation.

We also visited 80-year-old Rita, former head of the resuscitation department of the district hospital in Vinnytsia. Rita devoted her entire professional life to saving the lives and health of hundreds of people. From the perspective of her wisdom and knowledge, it is difficult for her to accept the fact that she needs reconciliation with the God of Israel through His son Yeshua, so let us entrust her to the Lord so that through contact with our dear co-workers who are in constant contact with her, she may open her heart to the Savior. Rita was moved to express her gratitude for all the help she receives.



We visited 75-year-old Leonid, who receives daily lunches at the canteen in Vinnytsia. Leonid raised his orphaned relative, who now, out of gratitude for the love shown, takes care of Leonid in his old age. His only son lives in Israel, but is in constant contact with his father. Leonid also has



a sister who lives in St. Petersburg. We ask you to pray for Leonid and, above all, for his salvation.

It was a great joy for us to visit 87-year-old Arkadiy. After the death of his wife Flora, Arcadia's health deteriorated significantly. Many years ago, Arkadiy entrusted his life to Messiah Yeshua, which radically changed his life. As a Holocaust survivor, he particularly appreciated the friend-ship and practical help he received from us. His wife, at the end of her life, on her deathbed, gave her life to the Messiah Yeshua, which was a great experience and joy for us. During our visit, Arkadiy greeted us with the words: Lord God, thank



you for everything, for my life and the friends you have given me. He also addressed us: You are my friends... your visits refresh my life...

Dear. Shortly after our arrival in Poland, we received news that our dear Arkadiy had gone to be with his Lord and Savior, whom he trusted with all his heart and who was his closest friend. In such moments, our hearts are filled with sadness that we will never see his smiling face here on earth, but on the other hand, we are filled with gratitude to the Lord Jesus for the fact that through the years of our service combined with practical expressions of love, the Lord opens the hearts of many from his beloved nation. for salvation in Messiah Yeshua. Arcadiy is one of the wonderful fruits of this service. We realize that without your practical financial support and pray-

ers, we would not be able to perform this service of mercy for God's chosen people, so we thank you from the bottom of our hearts for your donations and prayers in the service that we can do together for the glory of God's Kingdom.

On the same day, we visited 52-year-old Ina Ina and 62-year-old Yura, whom we helped a few years ago through a medical project. It then turned out that they both had cancer. Currently, they are still undergoing treatment for complications caused by cancer. Recently, Ina, while in hospital, slipped and fell down the stairs. This makes her very sore and in additional pain. Let us entrust Ina and Jura to the Lord so that they do not break



down in this difficult situation and trust the Messiah of Israel Yeshua in their lives.

We are very grateful to our heavenly Father for developing the project called Synagogue. As part of this project, 20 to 30 people gather every Friday evening to light Shabbat candles, reflect on appropriate fragments of the Torah, the Prophets and the New Covenant, and sing praises to the Lord. This project is led by members of the Messianic congregation in Vinnytsia. This project is the fruit of many years of practical service to God's chosen people in this area. Our presence in the Messianic congregation coincided with the special celebration of Rosh Hashanah, which begins the New Year in the Jewish calendar. It is the beginning of the autumn Feasts of the Lord, which culminates with Yom Kippur - the Day of Atonement. It was during this time that we had the opportunity to minister the Word of God during the Shabbat fellowship in the Vinnytsia. Let us continue to pray for good cooperation with the

members of this congregation, so that it will bear good fruit for the glory of the Kingdom of God in this service.

During our stay in Vinnytsia, we also visited one of the canteens. During this visit, we conveyed warm greetings on behalf of all of you who




contribute to the existence and operation of not only this canteen, but all the service that, by God's grace and mercy, we can conduct among the needy descendants of Abraham in this country. We also shared the testimony of God's Word and encouraged it to become an indispensable part of the lives of all those we help. Only the Lord in



His grace and power can make this a reality in their difficult everyday lives. For the bread of God is that which comes down from heaven and gives life to the world. Jesus answered them, I am the bread of life; whoever comes to me will never hunger, and whoever believes in me will never thirst—John 6:33 and 35.


After arriving in Gniań, we visited 82-year-old Borys. After the death of his wife, Boris falls into increasing dementia. The only thing that gives him motivation and the will to live is his small shoemaker's workshop. Boris is under the care of a social worker from the charitable organization Chesed. We have been cooperating with Borys as the chairman of the local Jewish community

for over twenty years and together we have experienced many beautiful moments providing practical help to the Jewish community of Gniew. Currently, Boris is at the end of his physical abilities that would allow him to deal with the everyday affairs of community members in need. With gratitude in our hearts, we pray for Borys' health and the strength he needs to function every day. First of all, we would like to ask you to pray for the salvation of Boris, so that he will find the way to eternal life in Messiah Yeshua. Happy is the helper of the God of Jacob, who trusts in the Lord his God, who made the heavens and the earth and the sea and all that is in them. He keeps faith



forever, gives justice to the oppressed and gives bread to the hungry Psalm 146:5-6a.

In Gnivan we also visited a ghetto prisoner, 84-year-old Anna. Many years ago, Anna's daughter tragically died. Since then, Anna has been completely alone. She has sporadic contact with her deceased daughter's husband, who tries to support his mother-in-law as much as he can. Unfortunately, they had no children, and Anna cannot enjoy her grandchildren. We are grateful



to God that Anna trusts the SaviorYeshua, who gives her peace and joy in difficult moments of her life.

At the end of our stay in Gnivan, we met with 45-year-old Lina, who will most likely take over the responsibilities for the functioning of the Je-



wish community in Gnivan from Borys. Lina recently suffered from cancer, but thanks to God's grace and the care of her son, daughter and husband, she now functions normally and works professionally. Let us pray for Lina and her family, so that when the time comes, with God's help, she will be able to take up this very responsible task of caring for the needy Jews in Gnivan.

The next town on our trip was Kalinowka, where, among others, we visited 80-year-old Raya. Raya experienced many nightmares during the Holocaust as a child. Many memories from those times come alive in her mind as she grows older. When we last visited Raya, she was seriously ill and everything indicated that she would remain bedridden. We described her situation in the last prayer letter from Ukraine. However, a miracle happened in Raya's life. Yeshua, her personal Savior, to whom she entrusted her life, showed her great grace and mercy and now Raya can move on her own and her health has improved significantly. Raja told us with great joy and excitement how her prayers had been answered. We are also grateful for your prayers in which you remembered Raya before God. Raja reads the Word of God every day and cultivates fellowship with the Lord Jesus. He has a great need for fellowship with other believers. Let us continue to entrust Rai's life into God's hands. Let us pray that the Lord will send Raya people with whom she can share her faith. For you are a refuge for the poor, a support for the poor in trouble; You




are a shelter from the rain, You are a refreshment from the heat; for the breath of the mighty is like the winter rain... – Isaiah 25:4.

In Kalinivka we visited 87-year-old Emma, who also survived the war, with the difference that she and her entire family were evacuated to Jambul in the South-Western part of Kazakhstan. The city, as the capital of the Zhambyl Oblast, offered a slightly better chance of survival for the whole family. Emma's father was drafted to serve in the Red Army, and her mother taught mathematics. It was difficult to survive from day to day on a very modest income, but they did not feel the breath of death that threatened them under the German occupation. My mother and Emma, who was the oldest of three siblings, still worked in the collective farm, thus ensuring survival in these very difficult times. In 1958, they happily moved to Kalinivka. Emma's parents and brothers had long since died, and Emma was left alone. Despite her difficult situation and loneliness, Emma radiated natural joy and optimism. She was very willing to receive the word from us about salvation through the Messiah Yeshua. Let us entrust Emma to the Lord so that the Spirit of God may open her heart to the Savior and Messiah of



Israel Yeshua. Can a woman forget her infant and not have compassion on the child of her womb? And even if they forget, I will not forget you – Isaiah 49:15.

While in Kalinivka, we met 77-year-old Nahum. Nahum's wife Ludmiła was taken to a nursing home, and her health condition is systematically deteriorating. Unfortunately, Nahum stubbornly maintains an atheistic attitude and it is difficult to talk to him about God. Despite this, we still hope that the day will come in Nahum's life when he will turn his heart and thoughts to the Messiah of Israel Yeshua, who gave his life for him. Please



pray for Nahum. Perhaps through this difficult situation he is experiencing now, the Lord wants to speak to his life and heart.

At the end of our stay in Kalinivka, we visited 66-year-old Aneliya, who is responsible for the



functioning of the Jewish community in this city and coordinates help for those most in need. Aneliya gratefully told us how this help brought tangible benefits to many people in their lives. Let not the oppressed return in shame: *let the poor and needy praise Your name!* – Psalm 74:21.

The next town we came to was Chmielnik, where we visited 74-year-old Eduarda, who is an animator of cultural and social life in the local Jewish community. Although she experiences many problems in her family, especially due to her daughter's illness, she still has hope in the Lord to whom she turns in prayer every day. We ask you to pray for Eduarda, so that in her pursuit of the



God of Israel she will find salvation in Messiah Yeshua.

In Chmielnik we visited 74-year-old Gienia. She is also involved in the life of the Jewish community of Chmielnik. She devoted her entire professional life to working in a bank. She lives alone and has no family. Gyenya struggles with many diseases that often make her everyday life difficult. When we shared with Gyenya our happiness that we experience in the messiah Yeshua, she listened to us with great attention and commitment. We are very grateful to God for this meeting, and Gyenya will remain in our prayers, so that the Lord and Messiah Yeshua will show her His mercy and open her heart to His salvation.



We also met with 74-year-old Aleksander and his wife, 63-year-old Ludmyla. They have three adult children and grandchildren, and part of their family has been living in Poland for a long time. When we talked about their lives and family, they commented that time passes so quickly that we can barely capture it in our thoughts and memories. They told us about Chmielnik, where befo-



re the war there were 20,000 inhabitants, including I I,000 Jews who were murdered and now rest in two huge graves. This is why we encouraged Alexander and Lyudmila to, in the face of the inevitable passing of time, take hold of Israel's Messiah Yeshua, who alone can bring them to eternal life.


Our visit to Shargorod was devoted to meeting our dear friend and colleague Wiktor, whose wife Bella, not so long before our arrival, went to be with the Lord to whom she entrusted her life. We found Wiktor in great despair over his deceased wife. We were able to talk together, pray and comfort him in this difficult situation. In all this, we realize that only the Lord can calm his desperate heart and give him his heavenly comfort and peace.

Through our visit, we wanted to fulfil what the Word of God encourages us to do in the Letter of the Apostle Paul to Romans 12:15: Rejoice with those who rejoice, weep with those who weep. Let us bring Viktor to the throne of God's grace so



that the Lord himself, who is the source of all comfort, may fill the void in his life that was left after the death of his beloved wife.

When we arrived in Bar, we visited 76-yearold Boris, who, due to military service, spent most of his life with his family in Turkmenistan. When he retired, he moved to his native Bar in Ukraine, where he lives with his entire family and grandchildren. During a short meeting, we were



able to pray together to submit their needs to Almighty God, who alone can save them.

In Bar we met 75-year-old Eduard, who also spent his entire professional life in the army, serving in East Germany near Magdeburg. He and his wife went to Israel and lived in Beersheba, but during his wife's serious illness they returned back to Ukraine. His two daughters still live in Israel, and after his wife's death he decided not



to go to Israel anymore. The main reason for this is his disabled son, whom he takes careful care of. We ask you to pray for Eduard and his son, that the time will come in their lives when they will meet the living Messiah of Israel Yeshua.

Our meeting with Misha and Svieta was very joyful. We have known our loved ones for many years and we were able to host them during one of the "Remove The Stones" projects that we regularly organize in our country. Misha and Sveta had heard a lot about salvation in Messiah Yeshua, but there was still no time in their lives when they consciously accepted Him into their lives. That is



why we are constantly asking for prayers for our loved ones, so that the Lord himself, through the Holy Spirit, may touch their lives so that they may experience salvation in the Lord Jesus.

At the end of our stay in Bar, we visited Sonia and her husband Leonid. Sonia coordinates assistance for needy members of the Jewish community in this city. We are grateful to God for Sonya and for trusting in Messiah Yeshua. In her life, Sonya went through a difficult and dark time when the Lord called her husband Piotr back to Himself. However, after several years of single-



ness, Sonya remarried and is now able to enjoy the joy of married life together. Let us entrust Sonya, her husband and her daughter, who lives with her family in Mogilev-Podilskyi, to Sonya. Her daughter also serves the Lord Jesus with all her heart and desires to be useful in serving His beloved people. God is the father of orphans and the guardian of widows in his holy dwelling place. God prepares a home for the abandoned and leads the captives to prosperity — Psalm 68:6.

The next stage of our trip to Ukraine was Vapnyarka, where we met 69-year-old Ludmiła. Lud-



myla's husband died two years ago, and her son is currently fighting at the front. It's very difficult for Ludmyla as a mother, because she is aware that her son may die at any moment.

We are grateful to God for this time spent with Ludmyla, who knows her Lord and SaviorYeshua. Together we also read the Word of God from the Letter of the Apostle Paul to the Philippians 4:6-7: Do not be anxious about anything, but in everything by prayer and petition with thanksgiving, let your desires be made known to God. And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus. It is this peace beyond human understanding that Lyudmila needs now. That is why we are asking you to remember Ludmyla in your prayers, so that the Lord Himself may calm her troubled heart and thoughts, and pour His wonderful heavenly peace through His Spirit.

We also visited 86-year-old Galyna, who has worked all her life as a gynecologist and obstetrician in a local hospital. Galina's entire family was



murdered during the Holocaust, and their bodies are buried in one of the large mass graves in Nemirov. Galina, as a little girl, was saved by a Ukrainian woman at the last minute and kept in her

house until the end of the war. We ask you to pray for Galina, so that in her loneliness she may turn to the God of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob, who in Messiah Yeshua became close to each of us.

In Tomashpol we visited Yura, who welcomed us with great joy and gratitude. Despite his disability and the many limitations associated with it,



Yura faithfully maintains his faith in Yeshua - the Messiah of Israel, who brings joy, optimism and peace into his life. Jura has just turned 51 and is under very good daily care.

After arriving in Bratslav, we met with Faina, who, as the head of the local Jewish community,



is responsible for its organization and functioning. Together with her colleagues, Faina is very actively involved not only in helping the most needy Jews in Bratslav, but also organizes the most urgent help for fighting Ukrainian soldiers. [26] We rejoice that Faina knows Yeshua as her personal Savior. Let us pray for Faina, her entire family who lives in Israel, and for further fruitful cooperation for the glory of God's Kingdom.

In Bratslav, we also visited 82-year-old Nina, for whom the current war situation in Ukraine is very difficult, especially since she survived the war and the Holocaust and miraculously the Lord sa-



ved her life. [27] Now her life is filled with fear for her and her family's future. Unfortunately, the situation Nina finds herself in is not an isolated case, as it reflects the situation of the majority of Ukrainian society, especially those who survived World War II and the Holocaust.

Before leaving Vinnitsa, we spent time with Marina and Seryozha and their colleagues. We are grateful to God for His great grace and mercy in their daily lives. We are glad that, going through difficult experiences, they stick faithfully to the Lord and want to imitate Him. Let us bring them together before the throne of God's grace, so that the Lord may nourish, bless and protect his faithful servants and all the service they perform for

their brothers in Vinnytsia and the entire Vinnytsia region. Among our dear colleagues is Nina, who is responsible for running one of the restaurants in Winnica. Recently, Nina was diagnosed with cancer, which was located on the back wall of the trachea. This tumor is located in such a place that it is very difficult to operate. Nyna is full of faith that her life is in the Lord's hands. We ask you, Dear Ones, to pray for Nyna, so that



the Lord in His grace will touch her life with the healing that is in His bruises and wounds. If any of you would like to financially support Nina's treatment, please donate to our account with the note "for Nyna". We believe that the Lord, in his grace and goodness, will allow Nina to go through this difficult time of illness. I sought the Lord, and he answered me, and delivered me from all my fears — Psalm 34:5.

In the following days of our stay in Ukraine, we came to Shepetovka, where we first visited the canteen, where we talked to our dear ones



who have lunch and dinner there every day. [29] It is our extraordinary joy that after 10 years of regular practical help for these people, the Lord opens their hearts to the Messiah Yeshua. We are grateful to God for Roza, who has been persistently sowing the Word of God in the hearts of her children for many years. When we last talked to us, Roza said: "It's not easy. Sometimes I feel so discouraged that I can no longer say anything, but then the Lord comes and pushes me forward to talk about Him. Even though Satan opposes me, I cannot stop..."

We are grateful to God for the time spent with Roza and her husband Zinov. They are responsible for the proper functioning of the canteen and



the entire service in the Jewish community in Shepetovka. Due to the enormity of numerous responsibilities, Roza and her husband not only experience health problems, but also spiritual struggle. However, despite all adversities, they want to place all their trust in the Lord God of Israel and the SaviorYeshua. We ask you to support Zinow and Roza in their prayers, so that they may experience God's support and peace in this work every day, and that the Lord will give them grace, wisdom and strength in carrying out this practical work of help. Blessed be the Lord! He carries our burdens every day - Psalm 68:20.

We spent the remaining time in Shepetovka visiting people in their homes. One of the visitors was 76-year-old Raja, who, due to her progressive rheumatoid disease, is increasingly unable to move on her own, and has progressive dementia, which is particularly troublesome for her loneliness. Despite her ailments and dementia, Raja knows well that she is protected by God and the Messiah Yeshua, to whom she entrusted her life

many years ago. We are grateful to God that Raya receives help from the canteen in Shepetovka and the emergency care that Roza organizes for her.



In Shepetovka we met 74-year-old Gyenya. Gyenya also lives alone and this is very trouble-some for her. Gyenya told us that of all the problems she had to go through, loneliness was the biggest one. Recently, Gyenya has developed a



serious liver disease, and doctors suspect that it is cancer-related. Gyenya is currently undergoing treatment. We ask you to pray for Gyenya, for her health and, above all, for her salvation.

While in Shepetovka, we visited 71-year-old Dora, who is a single person and, despite her own



health problems, is very active and is a great help to Roza and Zinov in their service to needy Jews in Shepetovka. Please pray for Dora, that the light of the Messiah may reach her heart, so that she may experience salvation in Messiah Yeshua.

The next person we visited was Raya, whom we had helped many times in the treatment of liver problems. Raya still struggles with these problems, and on top of that, her husband has seriously fallen ill with kidney failure. The only hope



and help for Raya in these difficult moments of her life is the faith and trust she placed in the God of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob. [34] Years ago, they also experienced a personal tragedy when their daughter suddenly died. To this day, they take care of their granddaughter, who unexpectedly became an orphan. As far as we can, we try to help Raya with the problems he and his family are going through. We also ask you to pray for Raya and her husband, so that the Lord will give them health and the necessary strength to raise their granddaughter. Let us also pray that they can entrust their lives into the loving hands of Messiah Israel Yeshua.

By visiting individual towns and people benefiting from this help, we see how indispensable it is in many cases, especially in the upcoming winter and the ongoing war with Russia. In this service of mercy for God's chosen people in need, we experience as never before how indispensable prayer is in an attitude of dependence on our Lord, who alone can send his provision, both material and spiritual.

In just a few months, eighty years will have passed since the end of World War II. Even though so many years have passed since the war and the resulting Holocaust, we often remember those who selflessly risked their lives to save the lives of many Jews. Everyone in our country has heard about Irena Sendler and many others who did this. In the Israeli Holocaust museum YadVa Shem, we can walk along a tree-lined avenue com-



memorating those people who were called Righteous Among the Nations.

The dark days of the Holocaust are long gone. New times have come, but in many respects equally difficult for many Jews. These are the times we live in that need the Righteous Among the Nations. Now is the time for us to stand before the Lord and in our practical attitude confess together: Yes, Lord, we will save Your beloved people. The prayers and gifts of your hearts for practical help to the poor Jewish population in Ukraine literally save the lives of many of them. Each of us can be part of God's plan to save these people in the spiritual and physical dimensions. fore, once again, we would like to thank those of you who are already part of this plan and at the same time we encourage you to join us in practical help for the people of God in choosing those of you who have not done so before. And my God will meet all your needs according to his riches in glory. in Christ Jesus. And to God and our Father be glory forever and ever. Amen - Letter of the apostle Paul to the Philippians 4:19.

To sum up our last trip to Ukraine, we can clearly say that this country is in great political and economic confusion and chaos due to the prolonged war with Russia. The official mass media cause widespread fear and uncertainty in the entire society. The upcoming prospect of the coming winter months further increases concerns about the future and existence, especially of elderly people who are most dependent on the help and care of others. For all of us, and especially for the many elderly people we serve, time passes more and more quickly.

Therefore, we are grateful to the God of Israel for every opportunity to help and contact our loved ones in Ukraine. Each meeting with them is another opportunity to give them a word of comfort and hope that is in their Messiah Yeshua. Each time material help, whether through canteens or food parcels, arouses gratitude in their hearts and is a clear testimony for them that the one who is God and Father for Israel does not forget about his people, and for this he uses each of us.

We ask you, let us pray for one another, so that by doing God's work together, we will make the best and most effective use of the time that lies ahead of us.

Therefore be careful how you walk, not as unwise but as wise, making the most of the time, because the days are evil - Ephesians 5:15-16.
